Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for KRAFT MEADOWS INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-19. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-17. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

The State of Michigan has not given Kraft Meadows Middle School a specific label.

Kraft Meadows Intermediate School transitioned from a 6th-8th grade building to a 5th and 6th grade building this school year. As we work through this transition and grade reconfiguration, we will continue to develop systematic processes that positively impact student achievement. The trends in our student achievement data indicate that Kraft Meadows Intermediate School has many areas to be proud of, as well as areas to improve. Through the school improvement process, our staff will continue to address these challenges. Currently, we are in the early years of a curriculum resource adoption in the areas of Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science. We will continue to work with the Kent ISD and the Michigan Integrated Behavior and Learning Support Initiative (MiBLSi) to deepen our knowledge on Multi-Tiered Systems of Support. Our school community is entering our first year of promoting positive student behavioral expectations through our positive school climate program. We will continue to adjust and modify this as we transition our school. Our staff will continue to use data to drive our instruction across all four content areas, as well as, in the area of special education. Our school is dedicated to the personal growth of all students, while providing a safe and orderly environment that stimulates academic achievement in our students.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Elementary School Pupil Assignment

Students are assigned to an elementary school in consideration of the following criteria:

- A. Current enrollment and capacity: Students are enrolled in elementary schools according to space available and maintaining equitable class sizes.
- B. Location: We attempt to place students in the school closest to their home residence. Our goal is to keep neighborhood children in the same schools.
- C. Siblings: We give priority to students who currently have siblings enrolled in specific schools.
- D. Parent Preference: If space is available, we attempt to place students in the school of their preference.

Middle School Pupil Assignment

- A. All incoming 5th and 6th grade students attend Kraft Meadows Intermediate School.
- B. All incoming 7th and 8th grade students attend Duncan Lake Middle School.

High School Pupil Assignment

All students in our district attend Caledonia High School
