Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2019-20 educational progress for EMMONS LAKE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2019-20 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Emmons Lake Elementary has not been identified by the State of Michigan as having any of these labels.

Emmons Lake Elementary has implemented a building wide systematic processes to positively impact student achievement. Trends in student achievement and data indicate that we have key challenges within our four core academic areas. The Emmons Lake staff has worked to address these challenges through the School Improvement Process and utilizing our Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS). Our team continues to collect and review data across our core subject areas to drive instruction and small group interventions. Our goal continues to be to integrate a MultiTiered System of Support (MTSS) across all four core academic areas in which 80% of students are achieving at desired levels and that the remaining 20% are receiving necessary supports. This process is evident in our collaborative grade level data meetings, which are held throughout the year. During these data review meetings, staff members review student progress, develop targeted instructional plans to address specific needs, and review the components of quality instruction within all academic tiers. In addition, the implementation and evaluation of our MTSS structure will drive our professional development and School Improvement goals over the next three to five years. We are confident that our *Multi-Tiered*

System of Supports (MTSS) provides a layered approach to teaching and learning by providing high quality instruction for all students, intervention in key skill areas for some students, and

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intensive intervention and support for those identified.

In addition to the MTSS system of academic supports, we continue to work on our *Positive Behavior Interventions and Support* (PBIS). This program supports all of our students by creating a positive environment to support increased student engagement. Through ongoing efforts, Emmons Lake Elementary staff will continue to evaluate data and make instructional decisions around student needs.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Elementary School Pupil Assignment

Students are assigned to an elementary school in consideration of the following criteria:

- A. Current enrollment and capacity: Students are enrolled in elementary schools according to space available and maintaining equitable class sizes.
- B. Location: We attempt to place students in the school closest to their home residence. Our goal is to keep neighborhood children in the same schools.
- C. Siblings: We give priority to students who currently have siblings enrolled in specific schools.
- D. Parent Preference: If space is available, we attempt to place students in the school of their preference.

Middle School Pupil Assignment

- A. All incoming 5th and 6th grade students will attend Kraft Meadows Middle School
- B. All incoming 7th and 8th grade students will attend Duncan Lake Middle School.

High School Pupil Assignment

All students in our district attend Caledonia High School
