Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan

September 21, 2020



The District will...

- 1. Make available approved Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan accessible through the transparency reporting link located on the District's website no later than October 1, 2020.
- 2. Create and make available a report concerning the progress made in meeting the educational goals no later than February 1, 2021.

The District will...

- 3. select a benchmark assessment aligned to state standards
 - administer the approved benchmark assessment, to all pupils in grades K to 8 to measure proficiency in reading and mathematics within the first nine weeks of the 2020-2021 school year.
- 4. If delivering pupil instruction virtually...
 - provide pupils with equitable access to technology and the internet
 - expose each pupil to the academic standards that apply for each pupil's grade level or courses in the same scope and sequence as the District had planned for that exposure to occur for in-person instruction.

The District will...

5. in **consultation with a local health department** will develop guidelines concerning appropriate methods for delivering pupil instruction for the 2020-2021 school year that is based on local data that are based on key metrics.

Key metrics shall include **at least all of the following**:

- COVID-19 Cases or Positive COVID-19 tests
- Hospitalizations due to COVID-19
- Number of deaths resulting from COVID-19 over a 14-day period
- COVID-19 cases for each day for each 1 million individuals
- The percentage of positive COVID-19 tests over a 4-week period
- Health capacity strength
- Testing, tracing, and containment infrastructure with regard to COVID-19

The District will...

6. determine, if safe, to **prioritize providing in-person instruction** to pupils in **grades K to 5** who are enrolled in the District.

The District will...

- 7. assure that instruction will be delivered as described in this plan and re-confirmed by the District Board, to include:
 - Re-confirming <u>how</u> instruction will be delivered during the 2020-2021 school year thirty days after the approval of the plan, and every 30 days thereafter at a meeting of the Board, and
- public comment from the parents or legal guardians of the pupils enrolled in the District during a public meeting described in PA-149.

The District will...

8. ensure that **students with disabilities** will be provided with **equitable access to instruction and accommodations** in accordance with applicable state and federal laws, rules, and regulations.

The District will...

9. ensure that **two (2)**, **2-way interactions** occur between a **pupil enrolled in the District and the pupil's teacher** or <u>at least one (1)</u> of the pupil's teachers during each week of the school year for <u>at least 75% of the pupils enrolled in the District</u>. The District will **publicly announce its weekly interaction rates** at each District Board meeting where it re-confirms how instruction is being delivered. The District will make those rates available through the transparency reporting link located on the District website each month for the 2020-2021 school year.
