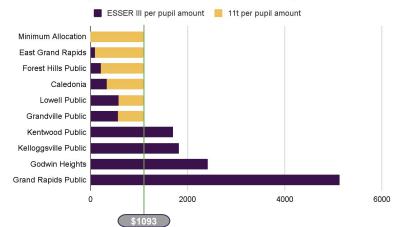

11†Additional Requirements**

Michigan legislators added these additional requirements:

- 51.4% must be spent to address Learning Loss
- 10.3% must be used for evidence-based comprehensive after-school programs
- 10.3% must be used for evident-based summer enrichment programs

Michigan Department of Education has <u>limited the use</u> of **11t funds** for **only** students who meet **one** of the following criteria:

- Economically disadvantaged
- English language learners
- Racial or ethnic minority
- Students experiencing homelessness
- Students in foster care

**These requirements do not apply to other federal COVID-19 funding.

Federal Stimulus Funds (ESSER 11t):

Estimated to receive \$3.8 Million (will be used on the following)

- Summer Programming
- General Ed Elementary Classroom Teachers
 (% of the teachers' cost working with eligible students under 11t)
- 7.5 Elementary Intervention Teachers (1 Math, .5 ELA for each elementary)
- 1 English Learner Teacher/Liaison
- Translation Services

Federal Stimulus Funds (ESSER 11t):

- English Learner Curriculum Supports
- 1 MTSS Coordinator
- .5 Speech Pathologist

Total Positions Added:

- 6.7 Teachers, 3.75 Support (General Fund budget)
- 21 Teachers (ESSER III & 11t budget)

(11 Interventionists, 5.5 Counselors, 1 English Learner Teacher, 2 Itinerants)
