

## Comprehension

Comprehension is the ability to understand and draw meaning from text. This includes:

- Paying attention to important information
- Interpreting specific meanings in text
- Identifying the main idea
- Verbal responses to questions
- Application of new information gained through reading



## Reading Nonfiction what he already knows about the topic. Look at the table of contents. thor includes lots of information in these "extras". know? Where could you find out?" Other Ideas does not know, show the picture or reread the page. Ask questions about character traits. Ex: "Which character do you think was kind? Which character was bossy? How do you know?" If your child doesn't know, give your an-Comprehension swer. You may need to do this many times before your child can do it. Encourage deeper thinking by asking, "If the story kept going, what do you think would happen next?" Help your child make connections to his/her life experience while reading. You could say, "Is there anything you read in the story that reminds you of something?"



Comprehension Activities—2-3

Sequencing comics - Choose a comic strip from the Sunday paper. Cut out each square and mix the squares up. Have your child put them in order and describe what is happening. Encourage your child to use words like first,

second, next, finally, etc.
