Given all the exciting changes that are to coming to our district, we have started hosting a Town Hall discussion on a different topic each month and will continue this until the conclusion of this school year. In future informational discussions, we will focus on transportation boundaries for our new school zones, the transitioning of our elementary buildings to K-4 facilities, the replacement of Dutton Elementary, the future of online school options, summer learning opportunities, and many other topics. Please continue to be on the lookout for information on the dates, times, and topics of these Town Hall discussions.

In fall 2019, we began our first year of providing STEM education for all students at the middle school level, while our spring STEM festival had to be canceled due to COVID-19 restrictions. We continue to move full speed ahead with providing STEM instructional opportunities for grades 6-8th this year and this will be extended to all fifth-grade students as well.

While COVID-19 has certainly thrown a curveball to students, families and schools across the country, our teachers and staff have done an amazing job with being flexible and moving forward under challenging situations so that we can continue to **Cultivate Agile Learners** who are ready for any challenge that life may bring.

Bond Update

hanks to the voters of Caledonia, in May 2020 our community approved an \$88 million school bond that will fund school facility improvement projects over the next five years. CCS made a promise to voters that we would be transparent and accountable for every penny of this bond, and we aim to keep that promise. On our district website, we have developed a dashboard designed to help people more easily track project deliverables and completion dates.

We have identified four priority areas for the bond to make it easier for our community to track progress and stay informed.

First, we are going through our buildings and facilities to make the necessary safety and security upgrades and repairs. This includes everything from playground repair to improving traffic flow and drop-off areas where possible so students can safely get to school.

Second, we are moving forward on making necessary improvements so we can realign grades for our elementary and middle schools, including the construction of a new Dutton Elementary School. There are several moving parts as we coordinate the various realignment projects and that is taking top

priority with work beginning as early as spring break.

Third, a new athletic community center complex - with a high school competition and community pool, community meeting spaces and resource center, and multi-use gym - is still on track to **OPEN** in late 2023. This includes our exciting partnership with the YMCA and the opportunity to make CCS a gathering place and resource for the whole community.

Fourth, we are making technology, equipment and furniture upgrades across the district. CCS is committed to preparing students for college and careers after graduation and these upgrades put our students in the best position to succeed. As we continue to face the challenges associated with COVID-19, we are truly blessed to be in a position where we can make the necessary technology upgrades and adjustments to ensure students are safe and can continue to learn in-person or online.

Grade Reconfiguration

ven during these unprecedented times, planning for the reorganization of Caledonia Community Schools is ongoing and we are excited to share some of the changes you can expect for the 2021-22 school year. Starting this fall, all 5th and 6th grade students will attend Kraft Meadows Intermediate School and all 7th and 8th grade students will attend Duncan Lake Middle School. More information will be available this spring as additional decisions are finalized. Here is what we know currently:

Schoolwide Schedule

Beginning this fall, Kraft Meadows Middle School will now be known as Kraft Meadows Intermediate School and will follow the secondary start and end times. The specific start and end times have not been finalized but will be shared later this spring. Kraft Meadows Intermediate School will unite all 5th and 6th grade students from the five elementary schools throughout the Caledonia Community School District. Duncan Lake Middle School will combine all seventh and eighth grade students in the Caledonia Community Schools district. Both schools will foster and encourage personal growth in all students while ensuring a safe and orderly environment that promotes academic achievement. The daily schedules for the two schools will include the following components:

- KMIS blend of an elementary/middle school schedule
- **DLMS** a more traditional middle school schedule
- · Teachers working in teams in the core content areas

The planned building reconfiguration as part of the Strategic Plan is well underway with the transition to be operational for fall 2021. Some of the construction updates in progress include:

Kraft Meadows Building Construction Updates

- · Classroom additions
- Cafeteria remodel and expansion
- Redesign of the parking lot and reconfiguration of student drop off

- New secure main office to be built on the west side of the building to also help with traffic congestion
- New science classrooms

Elementary school zones

uring the 2020-21 academic year, the district began transitioning to a building placement system based on geographic boundaries for each elementary school. Each home address in the district was assigned an attendance zone with a designated elementary building serving those residences. We are now entering year two of this transition. Please read the below information as there are important changes taking effect in August 2021.

IMPORTANT: Beginning August 2021

Transportation boundaries will be implemented. Transportation will only be provided to and from your zoned school.

Current elementary students will not be forced to move to a different building. They will be "grandfathered" in at their current school. However, if the building is located outside the family's attendance zone, parents will be responsible for transportation to and from school. Parents must apply for an In-District Transfer if they want to transfer their student.

The Internal District Transfer process will open for requests on Feb. 1, and close on March 15, 2021. Parents should submit requests through their PowerSchool account. Parents/guardians will be notified via email by April 1 of the status of their request. Approved transfers will take effect in August. A map of Elementary Attendance Zones, a FAQ document, as well as instructions on filling out a transfer request can be found at www.calschools.org/enrollment/.

Placement will occur on a first-come-first-served basis, dependent on seat availability and priority order listed below.

- **Priority 1:** Siblings who are attending separate buildings and wish to be reunited.
- **Priority 2:** Families who are attending a building outside of their home boundary and are seeking a transfer into their home boundary zone
- **Priority 3:** Families seeking an internal transfer for any other reason.
