Communications from Superintendent Dr. Dedrick Martin



Dear Caledonia Community,

I want to extend a heartfelt WELCOME BACK to the students and families for the upcoming 2018-2019 school year! I hope that you were able to spend time with family and friends and create wonderful memories during the summer break. We are excited about this school year and committed to maintaining a wonderful learning environment.

While I've only been with the district for a short period of time, I have been very busy working with district staff as we prepare for the upcoming year. One important task that we have accomplished was to fill the principal position for Duncan Lake Middle School. I'm happy to report that we have selected Mr. Jaym Abraham, an experienced school leader, to continue the tradition of educational excellence for which Duncan Lake Middle School has become known.

We are happy to report that due to the additional revenue received from the passage of the Kent County Enhancement Millage last May, we are able to add four additional positions for Student Support Specialists/Counselors to better support the social and emotional needs of our students. Additionally, we are nearing the end of the work on our facilities based on the passage of the bond in 2014, and will provide updates in the very near future outlining how your generous support of our schools was utilized.

As we embark on a busy fall season with the normal business of educating students, fall sports, and other extra curricular activities and events for our students, we are also approaching another opportunity for our community to continue its support for our schools through the upcoming Headlee Override Millage vote in November. The Headlee tax provision was enacted as far back as 1995 with the intent of protecting taxpayers by rolling back the tax rate when the tax base grows faster than the rate of inflation.

Rising Tax Base x Decreasing Tax Rate = Same Tax Yield

This is certainly the case in a growing community such as Caledonia. Unfortunately, without the aid of an override millage, the tax rate has fallen below the allowable 18 mills that our schools have used to fund daily operations.

So what does this mean?

This year alone our district will lose over \$71 thousand in revenue and this loss of revenue will increase each year without a successful override vote in November. However, if our community approves the override, **there will be no cost increase to homeowners**, this override will simply allow the school district to continue collecting the same 18 mills on non-homestead properties (property that is not a primary residence or qualified agricultural property) that we have used to help support our school operations for the past two decades.

Non-Homestead Operating Millage Proposal

What is a Non-Homestead Operating Millage?


Public Schools must levy 18 mills on non-homestead properties to receive full State Foundation Grant funding. A non-homestead property is any property that is NOT a primary residence or qualified agricultural property, such as a:

- Business
- Investment property
- Vacation home
- Rental property

The cost of 18 mills for the owner of a property valued at \$100,000 is \$1,800 per year.

What is a Headlee Rollback?


When property values rise at a greater pace than the rate of inflation the non-homestead tax levy will be Headlee reduced, known as a Headlee Rollback. Currently the non-homestead tax levy for Caledonia has been Headlee reduced to 17.8452 mills. Therefore, the district is losing 0.1548 mills of non-homestead funding for the per-pupil foundation allowance. This equates to a loss of approximately \$71,300 in 2018-2019, or \$14 per pupil, and continues to compound each year.



On November 6, 2018, as part of the regular election, members of the Caledonia Community will have the opportunity to vote on a non-homestead operating millage proposal. The information on the following pages is provided to help voters become educated on the proposal, and what it means for our community. Headlee Rollback Override

With the Headlee rollback the district will continue to lose funds unless voters approve an additional millage override to bring the district back up to the 18 mills. The district will be asking voters for an additional 1.5 mills for Headlee restoration purposes. This will allow the restoration of lost funds as well as a buffer in the event future Headlee rollbacks continue to occur. **At no point will more than 18 mills be levied on non-homestead properties.**



Note: The 18 mills equates to \$1,800 tax per \$100,000 in taxable value on non-homestead properties only and can never exceed that even with approval of the additional millage request.

Operating Millage Proposal on Non-Homestead Properties Frequently Asked Questions

Who pays the operating millage?

The operating millage is levied on properties that do not qualify for the Michigan homestead exemption (nonhomestead properties). Primary residences qualify for the homestead exemption and, therefore, do not pay this 18 mill tax.

What is a non-homestead property?

A non-homestead property is any property that is not a primary residence or quallified agricultural property, such as a business, investment property, vacation home, and rental properties.

Is this a new tax?

No. This millage has been in place since 1994 with the passage of Proposal A. The voters last approved a levy for 18 mills on non-homestead property in May 2015. The current millage expires with the 2020 tax levy.

What is the Headlee Amendment and how does it affect me?

The Headlee Amendment of 1978 changed the Michigan Constitution. At that time, real estate was increasing in value faster than the rate of inflation. So when taxing entities (cities, townships, state, etc.) calculated property taxes based on property value, they would collect more than the increase in inflation. The Headlee Amendment automatically "rolls back" the millage rate to equal the rate of inflation in order to keep taxes from increasing more than inflation.

Why is the district asking for a 2-year authorization?

The district has operated on a 5-year renewal cycle for the non-homestead operating millage. For the 2018 tax year the value of non-homestead properties in Caledonia has increased at a rate greater than inflation, which has caused the millage to be Headlee reduced. The non-homestead millage is an important portion of the state's perpupil foundation allowance and must be collected locally. The state calculates the amount the district should receive based on the voters levving the full 18 mills. If the millage has been Headlee reduced, the district's State Aid Foundation allowance is reduced based on not levying the full 18 mills, and during the 2018-2019 school year that reduction amount will negatively impact the district budget by \$71,000. The district is seeking community support for a Headlee Override operating millage to restore the non-homestead operating millage to the full 18 mills in a timely manner and will expire with our current Headlee reduced nonhomestead operating millage in 2020.

What is a Headlee Override?

A Headlee Override is a vote by the state statute, or a vote of the people and is necessary to counteract the effects of the Headlee rollback. On July 16, 2018, the Board of Education approved a ballot proposal of a 1.5 mill Headlee Override on the non-homestead operating millage because the millage has been Headlee reduced to 17.8452 mills. The authorization of the 1.5 mill override will allow the district to levy the full 18 mills on non-homestead properties during the 2019 tax year. At no time is the district permitted to levy more than 18 mills on non-homestead properties.

What happens if the millage does not get voter approval?

Failure to authorize the operating millage proposal would decrease our state School Aid Foundation allowance by approximately \$31 per student. The State of Michigan will not replace the lost funding due to voters' non-approval.

Cost to Homeowner: \$0

This operating millage proposal will allow the district to levy the full 18 mills on non-homestead property. **If approved, homeowners will not see an increase in their property taxes.** This millage proposal <u>will not</u> change the taxes on your primary residence. **This is not a new tax.** It is a proposal to restore the district to the full 18 mill assessment on non-homestead properties, which directly impacts the amount the district receives from the state School Aid Foundation allowance per-pupil.



They are held in public, and public comments will be allowed during the agenda time, "Interested Citizens." Each individual will be limited to three minutes and each topic to a total of					

20 minutes. Persons desiring to have a specific topic placed on the agenda may do so by notifying the Board President or Administration Office, in writing, no later than fifteen days prior to the date of the meeting. Upon prior request to the Superintendent, the district shall make reasonable accommodation for a disabled person to be able to participate in this activity. The Board of Education schedules workshops as needed. Those dates, times and locations will be posted as the workshops become scheduled.
