A New Opportunity to Learn With Caledonia Connected

or those of you who missed our April Town Hall announcement, starting in the fall, Caledonia Community Schools will be launching a fully online K-12 school called **Caledonia Connected**. The online school option offers a solution for students and parents who are looking for an alternative approach to traditional face-to-face learning and will utilize Caledonia teachers to deliver instruction.

Education is a journey. The journey, as we've learned, can sometimes have unexpected twists and turns. As a district, we are committed to providing safe and engaging learning environments and preparing students for tomorrow no matter the circumstances.

Caledonia Connected is one of the many opportunities provided by Caledonia Community Schools that allows students the flexibility to engage in a learning style that works best for them.

The enrollment window took place from May 10-28. Families who were interested in choosing Caledonia Connected applied online to join in May. There will be an additional drop and add window from August 9-13 at 11:59 p.m. during which families can select full-time online learning or stay in face-to-face learning for the 2021-22 school year. Any changes after that can be made only at the second semester point.

needed us the most." CAL CARES is
an initiative started this past year by the
foundation to directly support Caledonia

Community Schools (CCS). Thanks to donors and the strong base of the Foundation's endowment, the Foundation gave CCS a \$75,000 donation this fall to help offset the expenses of the new K-8 math curriculum. This allowed CCS to reallocate funds to reinstate the Student Supports Coordinator position that helps with the coordination of mental, social and emotional services to meet the needs of students at a time when it's so desperately needed.

In March, the CEF gave an additional \$10,050 to the district that was raised through our CAL CARES community campaign. This donation will provide transitional leveled reader resources for our K-8th





grade buildings as well as transitional activities for students, staff, and families as we transition to new middle school buildings in the fall.

The foundation also recently treated our staff with free pizza at Uccello's. This was a way to thank the staff for all that they have done to go above and beyond this year to provide the safest and best possible learning environment for our students and for helping families navigate this challenging educational environment.

CHS Launches Career Pathways Guide

t Caledonia High School we believe it's important for students to recognize and understand that there is a difference between college and career. Some students will choose careers that don't require college, and it's important for students to be thinking about what they want to do in their careers and then work on the path that will help them succeed in attaining that goal, whether college or otherwise.

This past year, Caledonia High School worked to develop six distinct Career Pathways to guide our students. Much of this work evolved out of conversations with our STEM community engagement group and work done by our student services department at CHS. Career Pathways are careers

that are grouped together because many of the people in them share similar interests and strengths. All pathways include a variety of occupations that require different levels of education and training.

Selecting a Career Pathway provides a focus students can begin exploring to determine a tentative career "fit." By identifying with a pathway, students are aided in selecting courses, extra-curricular activities and part-time employment that matches with their goals.

Career Pathways provide a plan for all students regardless of their interests, abilities, talents or desired levels of education. The following six Career Pathways have been developed by the state of Michigan and have been adopted by Caledonia High School.

Teachers handed out puzzle pieces when they "caught" students being inclusive in hopes to fill a bucket located in the main office. Prizes were awarded to all students when they filled the bucket half-way, and students earned the opportunity to throw a pie in Mr. Vydareny's face if they filled it all the way up! Students were especially excited to hear they had filled the bucket to the top with over 2,000 puzzle pieces, and had a great time watching Mr. V get several pies in his face! Lots of other great activities went on throughout the month including classroom time to bring more awareness about autism to students. The month ended with a fun-filled Spirit Week. Students learned about each other's passions outside of school and got a glimpse of the future through "Dress as what you want to be when you grow up" day. The staff found so many creative ways to shed light on how important it is to be inclusive and empathetic toward others. Way to go Panthers!





Bond Work Continues

n May 2020 the community passed the \$88 million bond for infrastructure and other improvements within the school district. We have come a long way in a

year, from having the outline of a plan and budget that passed the vote, to this summer when we will be completing the first \$20 million of work in the district.

The bond projects are divided in two areas:

- 1.Tower-Pinkster Architects and the Christman Company Construction are remodeling buildings, upgrading building systems and security as well as creating/ building a replacement for Dutton Elementary.
- 2. Stantec/C2AE architects and the Rockford Construction Co. are working on the future community center building, which includes pools, a gym, meeting rooms, exercise facilities and offices/ facilities for a resource center and senior programs.

Seven projects are underway this summer.

- 1. The remodeling of Duncan Lake Middle School began in March with the demolition of the old locker rooms and the media center. These areas have begun construction for the new science wing and upgraded media center. The long list of other updates at Duncan Lake will be starting through the end of school and through the summer.
- 2. Additions at Kraft Meadows Middle School also began in March with the addition of four classrooms on the west side of the building and a significant expansion of the cafeteria. Interior work and a large modification of the parking lots at Kraft Meadows will begin soon. The building will reopen this fall as Kraft Meadows Intermediate School reflecting the changed grade structure.
- 3. The Caledonia Schools Administration building began with heavy demolition and construction at the site of the former Glenmor High School. This work is well underway, and we are looking forward toward scheduling the moving of staff this fall.
- 4. Caledonia Elementary and Kettle Lake Elementary schools are getting new classroom Vertical Unit Ventilators that will supply the heating and add air conditioning to classrooms in these buildings. This work involves some major changes in ceilings and

behind walls for both buildings so air conditioning will be ready for the start of school. Additional work at these schools will be done next summer.





- The replacement of parking lots and paving is scheduled
 - to start in June at Caledonia High School (north),
 Emmons Lake Elementary, Operations/Transportation
 and the bus loop at Caledonia Elementary School.
 Paving work will also be completed at Duncan Lake,
 Kraft Meadows, and the (new) administration building.
 Please be patient as we close access roads and
 parking areas this summer, knowing they will be much
 improved in August.
- 6. The design and development of the community center building on Kraft Avenue is on schedule as this project transitions into its next phases in May and June. Construction drawings and bidding of the construction work is on track to take place this summer.
- 7. We began design on the new elementary school replacing Dutton Elementary in February. We are looking toward that facility opening its doors for the 2024-25 school year, welcoming the class of 2037 as kindergarteners in a new school building.

This is the first summer of four years of work as a result of the 2020 bond and we look forward to massive improvements in the years to come.
